Early Years & Key Stage 1 (Year 1&2)

Early Years' focus this week has been about seashores and changes over time. They learned all about entertained including learning about traditional Punch and Judy puppet shows. Children have made their own finger and stick puppets too.

Year 1 As well as learning about time in maths, including days of the week and months of the year, children have been learning about the planets in our solar system. They then worked hard to write an information text all about one of the planets.

Year 2 have been busy planning and writing their own stories based on the book 'Leaf'. They decided on the animal characters depending on their habitats and created a story mountain to help to structure the plot line.

Lower Key Stage 2 (Year 3&4)

Year 3 have been busy working hard on multiplication this week using a formal method to multiply 2 or 3 digit numbers by a 1 digit number. Children have also been excited to practise their shadow performance ready for their super performance this week.

Year 4 have enjoyed writing their own legends this week. After completing a draft in their books, the children 'published' their work using the chromebooks to help to present their stories with a front cover. They are super!

Upper Key Stage 2 (Year 5&6)

Year 5 have been learning about 3D shapes in maths. They practised identifying shapes using their properties and the key mathematical vocabulary faces, edges and vertices.

Year 6 have been busy rehearsing their Year 6 play by perfecting their lines and thinking about characterisation. They also enjoyed listening to the public speaking competition entries which pairs of children worked really hard on. Two children have been selected to take part in the York Civic Trust's competition next Wednesday and we all wish them the best of luck!
